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COMPONENTS OF A NARRATIVE PARAGRAPH

Setting

Establishing the time, place, and environment where the story takes place.

Characters

Introducing the people or entities that drive the narrative forward.

Plot

The sequence of events and actions that unfold, creating a compelling storyline.

Point of View

The perspective form which the story is told. It can be as the first-person point of view or the third-person point of view.

NARRATIVE PARAGRAPH STRUCTURE

1

ORIENTATION

This introduces the setting, characters, and time period of the story.

2

COMPLICATION

This is the main event or problem that drives the narrative forward.

3

RESOLUTION

This is the outcome of the complication, how the problem is solved or the situation is resolved.



EFFECTIVE TECHNIQUES FOR NARRATIVE PARAGRAPHS



Sensory Details

Engage the reader's senses by incorporating descriptions of sight, sound, smell, touch, and taste.



Vivid Imagery

Paint a clear picture in the reader's mind by using evocative language and imagery.



Character Development

Bring characters to life through their thoughts, actions, and interactions with others.



Dialogue

Use natural-sounding dialogue to reveal character traits and advance the narrative.

CRAFTING COMPELLING INTRODUCTIONS

START WITH A HOOK

Grab the reader's attention with an intriguing or unexpected opening line.

2

ESTABLISH THE SETTING

Provide contextual details about the time, place, and atmosphere of the narrative.

3

INTRODUCE CHARACTERS

Give the reader a glimpse into the personalities and motivations of the key players.

DEVELOPING CHARACTERS AND DIALOGUE

Character Archetypes

Explore a range of character types, such as the hero, the villain, the mentor, or the sidekick, to create depth and complexity.

Authentic Dialogue

Use natural-sounding dialogue that reflects each character's unique voice, personality, and way of speaking.

Character Development

Allow your characters to evolve and grow through the narrative, revealing their inner thoughts, emotions, and motivations.

Lexicogrammatical Features

- **Past Tense:** Stories typically unfold in the past, so past tense verbs are commonly used (e.g., "walked," "ran," "saw").
- **Time Conjunctions and Adverbials:** These words and phrases help to sequence events and indicate the passage of time (e.g., "then," "after that," "suddenly," "later").
- **Adjectives and Adverbs:** These descriptive words add color and detail to the narrative, making it more interesting and engaging (e.g., "suddenly," "quietly," "beautiful").

Lexicogrammatical Features

- **Dialogue:** Direct speech can bring characters to life and make the story more realistic (e.g., "He said, 'Hello.'").
- **Sensory Details:** Appealing to the senses (sight, sound, touch, taste, smell) can create a strong impression on the reader (e.g., "The crisp autumn leaves crunched underfoot.").
- **Figurative Language:** Devices like metaphors, similes, and personification can add depth and meaning to the narrative (e.g., "The wind whispered through the trees.").

DESCRIPTIVE NARRATIVE
