## 4 Concision

Conveying the definition in a clear and concise manner, avoiding unnecessary elaboration or tangents.



# Crafting an Effective Thesis Statement

## Clarity

The thesis statement should unambiguously identify the term being defined and set the stage for the supporting details to follow.

## Specificity

Avoid vague or overly broad definitions; instead, focus on the precise and unique characteristics of the term.

## Concision

Aim for a thesis statement that is clear and to the point, typically a single sentence in length.

## Relevance

Ensure that the thesis statement is directly relevant to the overall topic or argument of the essay or paper.

## Characteristics

Identify the key features, properties, or attributes that define the term and distinguish it from similar concepts.

## Functions

# Enhancing Flow and Coherence



## Transitional Phrases

Utilize various transitional words and phrases to guide the reader through the definition and maintain a logical flow.



## Coherent Structure

Organize the supporting details in a clear and cohesive manner, such as moving from general to specific or chronologically.



## Connections to Context

Ensure that the definition paragraph is well-integrated with the broader essay or paper, making explicit links to the overall topic or argument.



# Common Pitfalls to Avoid

## Overly Broad Definitions
